L'shana Tova. May this new year be a year of promise for us all. May we experience a renewed sense of vitality within ourselves and the Jewish community. The Jewish Museum and Cultural Center affords one this opportunity by providing programs of cultural interest. You can bond with others in an intimate and sacred setting.

Attendance at our programs has increased this year. We had a very successful summer music series which included The Jae Sinnett Trio, Bagels, and Fraylox, Trio Niche and Francesca Hurst.

We are continuing to sell daffodil bulbs which can be purchased for \$1 a bulb at www.jewishmuseumportsmouth.org. Four years ago, we partnered with the international Daffodil Project based in Atlanta, GA, and introduced this project to Hampton Roads. The project's goal is to plant 1,500,000 daffodils worldwide representing the 1,500,000 children who perished in the Holocaust and all children who are victims of humanitarian crisis. The daffodils are gorgeous and come from Amsterdam. There are over 7,000 daffodils planted on the grounds of the museum. If planting bulbs isn't your thing, you can donate to support the maintenance of the garden. To further beautify the area where the daffodils are planted, we started a fundraising project called the Paver Project. Pavers can be purchased for \$144 each to memorialize or commemorate family members or friends. This is a particularly special way to memorialize those whose family members lived in Portsmouth all their lives.

We have five films lined up for our Saturdays at Seven Cinema Series in January of 2026.

Jan. 3rd—8-1/2 (a 1963 avant-garde comedy-drama film co-written and directed by Federico Fellini);

Jan.10th—Defiance (a 2008 American war film directed by Edward Zwick, and starring Daniel Craig);

Jan. 17: *The Band's Visit* (a 2007 film about eight Egyptian musicians who comprise the Alexandria Ceremonial Police Orchestra, and arrive by mistake in a small town in Israel's Negev Desert);

Jan. 24: Cast a Giant Shadow (a1966 American action film based on the life of Colonel Mickey Marcus, staring Kirk Douglas, Senta Berger, Yul Brynner, and John Wayne)

Jan. 31: Woman in Gold (a 2015 film and true story about an elderly Jewish refugee, Maria Altmann, and her journey to retrieve family possessions seized by the Nazis, among them Gustav Klimt's famous painting, 'The Lady in Gold').

We are tremendously enthusiastic and excited about some new programing initiated by The Visual Arts Committee of the museum working in collaboration with the UJFT and the Chrysler Museum. On December 6, 2025 the *LEGACY 2025: Hampton Roads Jewish Artists of the Past* exhibition will be held at the Virginia Beach JCC on December 6, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. followed by a reception. There will be two other lectures in conjunction with this event. Please read further in this newsletter to learn about these three wonderful events. We look forward to seeing you at these events and hope you will enjoy each and everyone.



Legacy 25 Dor V'Dor From Generation to Generation - The Hampton **Roads Journey by Karen Plotnick**

Do not miss, Legacy 2025 Hampton Roads Jewish Artists of the Past comes to the Simon Family Jewish Community Center on December 6. 2025, at 6:30 p.m. This event is sponsored by The Jewish Museum and Cultural Center of Portsmouth, Va., The United Jewish Federation of Tidewater, and the Chrysler Museum.

Legacy 2025 will feature art of over 20 Hampton Roads Jewish artists who are no longer living. Three pieces of art by each individual artist will be on display. Family members or someone familiar with each artist will speak on each artist's behalf.

Many of you may have grown up knowing some of these artists. They may have been the parents of some of your contemporaries. Some of our local synagogues house their art. This exhibit affords the rare opportunity to become acquainted with local Jewish artists of the past whom you may never have heard of.

This is a first of its kind exhibition which will hopefully inspire other Jewish communities within our state and throughout the United States to emulate.

Guest Speaker: Mia Laufer, Ph.D.

Hampton Roads Jewish Artists of the Past in Context

Join Mia Laufer, Ph.D., Irene Leache Curator of European Art at the Chrysler Museum of Art for a sneak peek at the exhibition Legacy 2025: Jewish Artists of the **Past.** Drawing on the four main themes of the exhibition—Torah, Jewish Culture, Contemporary Aesthetics, and Personal Expression—Laufer will discuss the work in the exhibition and place it into the context of art practice in late 20th century American art.

Before joining the Chrysler Museum of Art in January 2025, Mia Laufer, Ph.D. held curatorial positions at the Des Moines Art Center and the Minnesota Museum of American Art. Laufer holds a BA in Art History from New York University and an MA and Ph.D. in Art History and Archaeology from Washington University in St. Louis. Her research often explores the relationship between modern art and Jewish identity.

Guest Speaker: Samantha Baskind, Ph.D.

The Remarkable Journey of Moses Ezekiel's Norfolk Botanical Garden Artist Statues

In 1877, Virginia-born artist Moses Ezekiel received the prestigious commission to carve eleven larger-than-life sculptures of some of the world's best-known artists to decorate the niches of the first building established in the United States with the express purpose to serve as an art museum. But less than two decades later, those statues were unceremoniously removed from the building and have since had a remarkable, peripatetic afterlife. Ezekiel's sculptures peppered the land around a swimming pool at a multimillionaire socialite's estate before they journeyed to an art dealer, then private hands, and for a time one statue was on display at a major American art museum. Now reunited, since the 1970s all eleven statues brush against flora and live among fauna at the Norfolk Botanical Garden.

Samantha Baskind, Ph.D. is Distinguished Professor of Art History at Cleveland State University. She is the author or editor of seven books, most recently Moses Jacob Ezekiel: Jewish, Confederate, Expatriate Sculptor. She served as editor for U.S. art for the 22-volume revised edition of the Encyclopedia Judaica (2006) and is currently editor of Penn State University Press's book series: "Dimyonot: Jews and the Cultural Imagination."
