

The Museum is proud of the December 6, 2025, event entitled *LEGACY 2025 Exhibition: Hampton Roads Jewish Artists from the Past* spearheaded by Board Member Myrna Teck who worked very closely with Board Member Richard Rivin. The event was well attended, enjoyable, and educational. It was eye opening to learn who our local Jewish Hampton Roads artists of the past were, and to view their art work. Some of us are familiar with their names since they were contemporaries of our parents and grandparents. Others were exposed to these artists, whose art and sculpture were displayed within our local synagogues or the grounds of the JCC and Temple Israel. All became better informed about Jewish artists from our Hampton Roads community.

On Sunday, December 14 at 2:00 p.m. at the Chrysler Museum, Samantha Baskind author of *Sir Moses Ezekiel, a 19th century Jewish Sculptor* spoke about this renowned artist and former Virginia Military Institute cadet.

Our annual cinema series will run every Saturday evening in January with doors opening at 6:30 pm for refreshments and a prescreening talk and the film beginning at 7:30 p.m. The concluding film on January 31st entitled *8 ½* will be presented as a tribute to Tim Cooper of blessed memory. We thank the UJFT for taking items and records of B'nai Brith and Jewish War Veterans. This allowed us to vacate storage space in the downtown branch of Portsmouth Public Library. After nearly twenty years, we emptied a storage unit providing an annual savings of \$3,084.

I would like to express my deepest appreciation to our Donors, Volunteers, Board Members, and Executive Director for their dedication to preserving Chevra T'helim and look forward to the future growth and development of this very special entity. Happy Holidays to everyone, and my very best wishes to everyone in 2026.



WORLD AFFAIRS COUNCIL Hampton Roads


